

Forget Me Not

Supporting families in Nepal

The Fraser Coast community is set to get colourful for a cause close to the hearts of many locals on June 2 when they gather for the third annual Colour Stampede.

In 2017 Hervey Bay locals Olivia Hay and Thomas Biden decided to throw some colour on the global orphanage crisis and engage the Fraser Coast community to support families in Nepal. The pair brought to life their idea of a Colour Stampede to raise awareness that more than eighty per cent of children in orphanages have at least one living parent aching for their children to be returned home, where they belong.

"We are proud to be fighting the global orphanage crisis because research tells us children do much better when raised in loving families instead of institutions like orphanages and children's homes, no matter how well run they are.

"What's worse is the fact that most kids in orphanages are not actually orphans! They're forced to live this way because traffickers have taken advantage of their family's poverty and want the very best for their children. Parents will do almost anything for their children to live their best lives no matter where in the world they live, and these parents are no different.

"Yet these families are often tricked into sending their children away for an education that is meant to be their ticket to a brighter future. The parents have no idea that their children are actually going to be branded 'orphans', told their families don't want them, and forced to live a lie.

"I've met some of these kids and they've told me that it was expected for them to look impoverished and needy in order to get sympathy and donations from volunteers and tourists who visit with open hearts and deep pockets," Olivia said.

"It's a crazy world but we have seen first-hand the difference this volunteerrun community fundraiser makes to the lives of children in Nepal through the work of Forget Me Not. It's a game changer for these families and Liv and I believe every child deserves a family, our own families are so important to us."

"We have lots of things planned for this year's Colour Stampede to make it bigger and better than ever! Food and drinks will be available, we have great entertainment lined up, Optus have donated a couple of phones for auction, and the major raffle prize is a weekend away at Kingfisher Bay Resort," Thomas added.

Hervey Bay business leaders are also backing the event. Linda Bland said, "Century 21 Commercial are thrilled to sponsor the Colour Stampede again and support the fantastic work that Forget Me Not does in keeping children with their families and providing families and communities with the support they need."

Forget Me Not CEO Andrea Nave said, "I am privileged to have been a part of the Forget Me Not story from the early days when a small group of Hervey Bay locals decided there was something, they could do together to make the world a better place.

"It's been a magnificent journey and this event is an excellent example of how change can be powerful, life-changing and fun! I'm so proud of Olivia and Thomas and their journey from observers to participants to leaders and agents of change. The future's in good hands!

"I'm looking forward to happy faces and lots of laughs along the colourful 2.5-kilometre fun run through beautiful Susan River bushland – everybody is welcome,"





Executive Chef @ Bay Fusion Food Design Shares with us his favourite Recipes.



A few ingredients to put together, but a really simple party food dish where your guests can build their own, or it can be plated up for a delicious snack.

Ingredients Feeds 6

2 x pack small soft tortillas 3-4 inches

1 x 400g tin fried beans 1 x 400g tin black beans 400g Rare roast beef (we use our finely sliced smoked sirloin from Arkarra Low+Slow)

1x 250g Greek yogurt strained

- 1 x bunch coriander
- 1 x medium carrot
- 1 x medium onion
- 2 x sprigs shallot 1 x chilli
- 1 x mixed baby tomatoes
- 1 x mixed shredded cheese
- 1 x lime

Sea salt and cracked pepper

Homemade taco spice

(remove chilli flakes for a milder product)

- 1/4 Tbsp. Chili Powder.
- 1/4 tsp. Garlic Powder.
- 1/4 tsp. Onion Powder.
- 1/4 tsp. Crushed chilli Flakes.
- 1/4 tsp. Dried Oregano or mixed herbs fine.
- 1/2 tsp. Paprika.

- 11/2 tsp. Ground Cumin or crushed fennel seed.
- 1/4 tsp castor sugar
- 1 tsp. Sea Salt.

Hang the yogurt overnight if possible, in a bowl or fine strainer to remove all excess moisture from yogurt. Slice fine the French onion, red onion, chilli and matchstick the carrot. Cut baby tomatoes Empty black beans from the tin and wash Place fried beans in a bowl, season and add a little of the grated cheese. Place all tortillas out on the bench, smear bean and cheese mix lightly on the bottom layer of tortilla crack pepper and place on the lid. Pre heat oven and Bake 160 degrees for 1-2 minutes Place tea spoon of yogurt to hold your beef and







Why can't I wear black as well as Susan can?

Have you ever wondered why some days you look slightly 'off' and other days you just radiate? Often its to do with the colour you're wearing

Believe me when I say there is a real science behind the colour spectrum and how to wear it to suit your uniqueness, but I assure you that once you get it, it'll flow oh so easy.

Black is another prime example, and the colour black can really kill it for some women. If black just isn't your friend, it'll do things to your appearance like bring out the dark circles under your eyes, make your skin appear drab and lifeless, accentuate your fine lines and blemishes, and generally just make you look tired and run down. Does this mean no black for you? Not necessarily. Just wear it with intelligence. For example, wear it away from your face. Wear it in pants, skirts, shoes, or if you're wearing it up top, break it up with a scarf or accessories to bring it back to work for you and your unique colouring. Better still, wear black in the many shades that it comes in that will be better for you. Charcoal is a brilliant substitute for black.



"Hope" is an exhibition that arose when my husband had the experience of having to deal with his aggressive skin cancer, which meant surgery and then radiation therapy. This in itself filled us with all sorts of emotions for the person involved and also their family and friends.

The radiation was quite harrowing for my husband. A personal mask was made for him, as it is for all the others who undergo

radiation. During the treatments, it was placed over his head and secured tightly to the bed so his head couldn't move at all. This ensures that the radiation goes to the correct spot. The mask was completely over his face so the treatment could be effective, but it was also very uncomfortable, he would come out with criss-cross marks embedded in his face from the mask.

Even though each session was difficult, it was made lighter by the staff involved who worked at the

clinic, and also by the men and women waiting for their own turn. Everyone waiting knew what was going to happen but everybody tried to make the experience as pleasant as possible by talking to those around them, and trying to be happy and cheerful, some even made jokes.

The feeling of "HOPE" was palpable in the waiting room. If you closed your eyes you would think you were at some celebration, rather than a radiation treatment! The ending of the radiation therapy was celebrated by the staff and clients by the presentation of "your own personal mask" your handprint was also put on the wall of the clinic with your name under it, with the others who had also finished their treatments.

The masks themselves were skillfully, intricately, and beautifully, made. It felt to me as if they were a work of art in themselves! It was like a two-edged sword - They were intrinsically beautiful, but for the patient, a cage which held them in when necessary, while also allowing the



light-saving light to penetrate and to heal. So this "Mask" became a symbol to myself and my husband of the "Hope" for the future, as it did for so many passing through the Radiation Clinic. I decided to use this mask as the symbol for an

Exhibition dealing with the "Hope" that is given to us by modern medicine and all that this entails.

In the exhibition itself, I'll have masks that have been used in the Radiation Clinic. I feel that these masks that don't have any names,

are a symbol of "everybody", as in the unnamed soldier, who represents all of the soldiers at the time, thereby representing all of the people who had radiation treatment.

I hope this exhibition will give the general public more of a in-depth recognition of the personal journeys that all patients, their families, doctors, nurses and staff go through. I feel that it would also give present and past cancer sufferers a platform to bring these subjects up and talk about them to those around them, in a safe and informal place, not only in a doctor's surgery. I have found this before with exhibitions on these "hard" subjects. It gives people a chance to tell their stories & express their feelings while walking around in a casual atmosphere, with subjects they may not have been able to approach before.

I hope the "Masks of Hope" will be seen as a positive and empowering object. Overseas in art therapy classes, the masks have been painted in each participants particular Super Hero!

I'm hoping that this exhibition will be beneficial on many levels — to the cancer sufferers, their family and friends, the support organizations and also to the general public. I've found that awareness and education always tends to demystify difficult subjects.

I have always loved music, from the age of four years old. There is a video of my little sister and I singing to 10,000 people on the beach at Surfers paradise for a Christmas production that the church put on, but I never thought about doing it as a living.

I actually only fell into it about five years ago. I was working as a road worker and discovered Open Mic Night with Mak on a Thursday night. I only knew one or two songs at the time. Then I did a Friday live session on Sea FM, from there I was invited to open the next night for Dogwood Crossing. When I was asked, I didn't even know an hour's worth of music, so I went home and stayed up all night learning various songs. I remember that I threw up in the bathroom right before I went on, but then I was fine

and did an hours set for them, the rest is history. By mid-2015 I was a full-time musician.

My wife and I have three boys and two girls... and lots of pets, we have guinea pigs, four horses, two pigs, chickens, ducks, cats and dogs.

I am doing about five gigs a week, I do try to keep them from Thursday to Sunday as that is my working week. I also do some Graphic Design work. I actually get more quality time with the family than when I was doing the roadworks, and of course my family do get to come along on some gigs.

We have an eleven-foot pop top campervan that I gutted and renovated that we have taken right down to the Great Ocean Road and back. Sometimes my son Dallas gets up and sings with me as well, that is pretty special.

Tell us about - An Afternoon to Remember recorded live at the Bondstore?

An Afternoon to Remember was recorded last year and ended up being a double CD. The album consists of six originals and a heap of covers. All of the songs off my EP were redone live on the album. It was a brilliant afternoon and that comes across on the album. With about sixty people in the audience it was really intimate.

Where will your new album - Better than Me be recorded?

Better than Me will be a live album and is being recorded on Sunday, June 16 at the Criterion Hotel. This is a ticketed event and I am very happy to say that it is almost sold out. It will be a great afternoon.

Do you design all of your own album covers?

Yes, for the next album I am building my own guitar that will feature on the front. I am going to the Gold Coast in June for two weeks to do a guitar making workshop, I will come back with a high-end performable guitar. On the neck of guitars, you have little mother of pearl inlays that mark the different guitar frets, I have designed a symbol for each of my five kids that will be in the neck of the guitar. I will put that in the promo as well as on the album cover.

What would you like the people of the Fraser Coast to know about Derek F Smith?

I grew up in the church but over the last few years, I have really been struggling with what I believe in and why. I question everything and not just accept things at face value or because I have been taught. One thing I notice is that there is so much dogma in the world.

For example, the Christchurch tragedy. I think we just need to see more tolerance, acceptance and understanding of other people. 'Seek first to understand and then be understood,' Is a great saying.

We are all one human race if you believe in a god there might be an afterlife, but we know for sure that we have one shot so let's make it count. Love each other, help each other and support each other.
