

In his first two weeks in the Fraser Coast, Ken has already travelled more than a 1,000 kilometres visiting Council work sites and exploring the region's tourism offerings.

This conservation and awareness based event is full of heart with visitors encouraged to jump aboard a paddle board, kayak or boat to celebrate a love of whales in the whale-watching capital of the world.

The Fraser Coast is Australia's Home of the Humpbacks where the natural shape and calm protected waters of Hervey Bay offer a natural playground for thousands of the majestic mammals, and the best up-close and personal whale watching encounters in the world.

Every year more humpback whales are migrating from Antarctica to the warm waters of the Whitsunday Islands to breed. With the figure now an estimated 22,000 humpback whales making the journey, this message of love and conservation remains as important as ever with the humpback numbers rebounding from perilously low numbers as an endangered species in recent history.

On their return journey between late July and early November, proud new humpback parents and the cutest calves on earth make a temporary home in the tranquil marine environment of Hervey Bay creating a wonderland of intimate and interactive whale activity.

A FOCUS ON OUR LOCAL MUSICIANS

Soul City

Soul City is touted as 'Queensland's premiere Soul, Funk, Pop and Rock Cover-band', they have a great sound with a big-band feel. I caught up with two of the founding members of the popular local band a couple of weeks ago.

Andre Carpenter and Rob Symon gave me a bit of an insight as to what the band is all about.



Soul City have been fortunate enough to receive a grant through the council Regional Arts Programme for a series of promotional photos and video to develop the profile of the band. Founding member Andre said, "We would like to thank the Fraser Coast Regional Council and the Regional Arts Development Fund for assisting us with this goal."

When did Soul City Form and how?

Andre: We formed in the middle of 2013. I was looking at doing something to boost the profile of performing musicians around town, particularly for brass, saxophone and trumpet. We did the Migaloo Swing with the Hervey Bay City Musicians a few years ago and trialled our concept. At the time we only had one set with lead vocalist Brian, a five piece horn section and a full rhythm section, this was really well received. From there we then wanted to see if we could make something work with an eight piece band. We rehearsed in a shed out at Dundowran and we realised after a couple of rehearsals that we worked well together.

The intention was to actually boost the profile of those sort of bands to show the local community we have got top players and performers in the region that prior to that really didn't have an opportunity to perform in the public arena. So it was nice to be able to provide that opportunity.

What has been your biggest challenge as a band? How do you overcome that challenge?

Rob: I think getting venues to have us play. It hasn't gone unnoticed that the bigger venues have not shown an interest. We know we could play great venues in Brisbane but obviously it is the tyranny of distance as we all have day Jobs.

Andre: Securing those bigger venues has not been through a lack of trying on our behalf either, we specialise in those bigger venues. To me as an organiser it is disappointing not to have access to those places.

It is also challenging to keep the repertoire fresh as well for our audience. So this is something that we are constantly working on.

Why did you guys pick this genre of music?

Rob: For me four and five piece bands are a dime a dozen. But as soon as you get an eight piece band with a horn section it is a lot harder. To hear all those classics, the Woodstock kind of songs like Chicago is a lot rarer for me that is the whole goal, to recreate that Woodstock experience.

Andre: To find charts that incorporate a three piece horn section or incorporate a horn section is a specific genre which lends itself to that particular instrumentation. We are just so fortunate that it just so happens to be Brian's favourite genre, and it works really well for us because we enjoy the charts and it just so happens that every one else seems to gravitate to the kind of music we play because the songs are absolute classics.

What are your Rehearsals like? Do you have a set time each week to practise or are they more spontaneous?

Rob: They are generally fairly regular, Thursday nights have been our rehearsal night. But we do go through periods where if we are gigging a lot we won't have a rehearsal that week, or when a player is away we can be a little light on.

Andre: We rehearsed enough in the early, formative years to ensure that we know how to work together and we know when a new chart comes out that it is rehearsed and that everyone knows it prior to the rehearsal. Then we let the members know that that particular chart will be in the repertoire that weekend. We are very fortunate to have musicians that are good enough and trained enough to be able to just do that.

The Changing Faces of Maitlia

“Changing Faces of Maitlia” is the name chosen by Maitlia Potters to celebrate their 40th birthday. A number of events have been planned for August to recognise this achievement.

Maitlia Potters was formed in 1977 by a group of people who were the students of Mr. Ted Meredith, a well-known Maryborough potter. The word “Maitlia” is an aboriginal word for clay. The group originally met weekly at each other’s homes transporting their pottery wheels in the boot of their cars. As new members joined, the more experienced members helped the new comers.

In 1984 we took a courageous step and purchased a property in Albert Street, Maryborough. We became incorporated and began the business known as Bottlebrush Crafts. Craft classes in appliqué, patchwork, sketching, floristry, pottery and sculpture were offered and proved very popular. Children’s classes in pottery and sketching were always in demand. Exhibitions promoting the work of talented artists and craftspeople of the area were arranged and over the years saw some wonderful displays of quality hand-crafted items.

Seminars and workshops with recognised highly qualified tutors were periodically arranged to allow members to improve their skills and keep abreast of the latest trends. Getting out and about in the community, displaying and demonstrating at events and functions whenever possible was and still is an important function of the group. The teaching of pottery to the very young and the aged remains a priority.

In 2007 we moved to 30 Ferry Street and now we have eight groups meeting to exchange experiences. This is a major part of our operation. Even though the group was originally formed as a potters group, amendments to the Association rules allow all people interested in art and craft to apply for membership. We are a not for profit organisation committed to promoting the growth and development of arts, craft and pottery in the Maryborough area.

Fund raising is always a necessary part of any organisation. Over the years our winter soup nights have become legendary. The members provide a range of tasty soups and bread, and guests are able to choose a handmade pottery soup bowl from which to eat their soup and keep them as a memento of the evening.

It seemed appropriate that in celebrating our 40th birthday we should have a gala exhibition showcasing the work of not only our members and past members but the groups who meet at Bottlebrush Crafts. This exhibition will be officially opened on 5 August at 3.30pm at Gatakers Artspace in Maryborough. Those groups represented will be Heritage City Porcelain Painters, Fraser Coast Lace Makers, Merry River Social Art Group, Sew Wednesday, Dolls with Attitude, Card Makers, Spinners, Weavers and Dyers of Maryborough, Mudlarks Sculpture Group and Maitlia Potters. We are grateful to Regional Arts Development Fund for the assistance afforded to us in this birthday celebration project.

Maitlia Potters has grown from humble beginnings to what it is today. Our face over 40 years has changed and to celebrate this, we are conducting a mask competition which is open to adults and children of the area. The closing date for this is 12 August and entries must be received at Bottlebrush Crafts, 30 Ferry Street by this date. There will be a Mask Exhibition wine and cheese opening and presentation of prizes at Bottlebrush Crafts on 18 August at 6.00pm. On 19 August also at Bottlebrush Crafts, we will be holding an Open Day. Craft groups such as the China Painters, Potters, Sculptors, Lace Makers, Merry River Painters, Doll makers, Spinners and Weavers and Card Makers will be demonstrating their crafts between the hours of 9.00am and 3.00pm.

Members, past and present will have the opportunity to get together and reminisce about past experiences at a birthday dinner to be held on 5 August. It is hoped these events throughout August will not only be a celebration of past years but a chance to encourage people in this community to try a craft. Hobbies can be not only relaxing but bring great pride and satisfaction when a project is completed.

Steve Starling was fishing with us recently, and although we could see lots of big fish on the sounder, they just weren't biting. He comes up with some great captures by downsizing his gear, in the case of the GT and Diamond Trevally shown here, he used his 8lb Bream gear to finesse a bite from these bigger fish. That he landed them, is a credit to his skills and experience!

So my tip for this month... sometimes you need to go light to get the bite! And if you'd like to experience fishing in Hervey Bay, check out my website or give me a call!





How long have you been a Kitchen Operations Manager at the Carriers Arms?

It has now been over 10 months since I started working here. During this time there have been many positive changes. Here at the Carriers we are about to undertake some renovations, by the time this magazine comes out I will have been to Brisbane and met architects and kitchen suppliers and looked at everything from bowls, spoons, and chairs, in fact anything to do with hospitality. I have been allocated a budget to spend for the renovations.

Who was your biggest inspiration when you were training to be a Chef, and why?

I think everyone in my generation looked up to Jamie Oliver. He was a big inspiration for every young apprentice Chef back in the late 90's everybody wanted to be like Jamie.

Then the Gordon Ramsay's, and Marko Pierre White's came along and you really looked up to them. They have taken our industry so far, maybe without those guys our industry wouldn't be what it is today.

How would you sum up the menu?

Modern Australian up market pub food is the best way to describe it. It is not contemporary. I give the chefs a free range on how they are going to produce their menu, and how they will plate up their dishes. I like my staff to think outside the box. I don't like easy, simple or same. If you are going to come to the Carriers I don't want you to have the same as you can have down the street.

Tell us some of the more memorable moments of your career?

I have catered for many private functions for some of our famous politicians like Kevin Rudd, Tony Abbott, Malcolm Turnbull, and Joe Hockey. I have actually been to John Howard's personal residence as I did a function there, that was pretty special. You see a different side of them after they have had a few bottles of wine, they were really good to have a laugh and a Joke with, at the end of the day, they are all human beings. I remember that the secret service constantly walked through the kitchen checking the fridges, the food, and everything in-between.

What is the most popular dish on the 'Carriers Bistro' menu?

I would say at the moment probably our Organic Lamb-shanks, with a garlic and spinach mash and a hardy beef dew with a modern touch. We also have some great \$10 lunch specials available seven days a week. These change every day as we like variety.

What is the newest trend that you see emerging?

Fresh, organic and cleaner food. People like simple, plain ingredients with a modern twist on the way that it is styled on the plate. People are getting out of the more complex dishes and wanting something easier.

Do you use many local suppliers?

All of our suppliers are local. I use a local Butcher, Luke from Greg's Quality Meats, I know all the different cuts of meat and have a good relationship with them and they source the best ingredients for me. My Fruit and Vegetable supplier is Chris from Fraser Coast Fresh Produce. My fish comes from Michael at Hervey Bay Fisheries. I shop to support our local farmers and to sustain our region.

What advice would you give a novice just getting into the business?

Hang on and get ready for the ride, at the end will be a reward that no one can take away. It is a hard journey but if you can hold yourself together and know where your goals are it is a great industry to be in. It will drive itself if you are passionate about food and prepared to work for it.

What is the strangest item in your fridge right now?

I have blood worms in the fridge at the moment – Not fit for human consumption I might add. They are to feed our tropical fish in the fish tanks in our hotel.

Chicken, Herb and Parmesan Delight



"This recipe is definitely a family favourite of ours and eaten at least once a week. Packed full of flavour and spice even the kids will love it." Kim Parnell, What's On Fraser Coast.

List of Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons of extra virgin olive oil, you will need a little more for drizzling later.
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 400g tin of chopped tomatoes
- 1 teaspoon of sea salt
- 1 teaspoon of sugar
- A pinch or two of black pepper
- 2 tablespoons of fresh, finely chopped basil
- 4 - 5 chicken breast fillets, diced
- 100g fresh mozzarella, roughly torn
- ½ cup of parmesan, grated
- 2 tablespoons of freshly chopped parsley

Method

Heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a saucepan, Add garlic and cook stirring for a few seconds then add the tinned tomatoes, salt, sugar and the pepper. Keep cooking and stirring until the sauce reduces and begins to thicken. Remove pan from the heat and stir through the basil.

Preheat the oven to approximately 180°C and heat 1 tablespoon of oil in a large pan. Add the chicken and cook on high for approx 1-2 minutes on each side, or until golden. Transfer the chicken into an oven proof non stick baking dish. Then pour the tomato sauce topping evenly over the chicken, followed by the torn mozzarella, then sprinkle with the parmesan, finish off by drizzling a small amount of the olive oil on the top of the dish.

Place in a preheated oven and bake for 20-30 minutes, or until brown on top, remove from oven.

Plate Up

Serve with a nice fresh salad some crusty bread and a glass of your favourite wine. Serves 4-5.


