









Have a Merry Christmas and a happy New Year!







on Thomas is definitely one of the stalwarts of the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club. His time on Hervey Bay beaches has been well documented - as I look through his much-thumbed photo album. There are many newspaper clippings and photos of a bronzed Ron in nothing but his speedos. Very rarely standing still but always on the move.

At fifty-eight he still has that charm, with his huge smile and warm personality you get the impression that he would be a fun person to be around, a great mate!

Like many parents, Ron became involved in Surf Life Saving after his daughter joined as a Nipper. Parent involvement is encouraged, so not long after he decided to become involved himself by gaining his Bronze Medallion and progressing through the ranks from thereon.

In fact, all of Ron's children have grown up at the Hervey Bay Surf Life Saving Club, long before it was actually a club, and now the third generation of lifesavers is coming through with a grandson who has just started Green Cappers in Bundaberg as of last season.

Ron says, "When I first started surf life saving we had a backboard for someone injured, our rescue board and a first aid kit - and that's all we had, we would sit under the trees, now the volunteers have progressed to a fully self-sufficient risk-based compliant site. There is a lot more management now and it is a lot more professional."

At the club level, Ron acts as the safety advisor for the committee. While on the beach he is a Patrol Captain who delegates jobs to the patrol members and organise's the guys and girls for their shift.

"One of the things that people aren't really fully aware of is that we have a tidal rip in Hervey Bay, we have a gutter about 60 metres off the shore that will rush in and out with the tide, sometimes kids can get caught up and swept up or down the beach - so stay vigilant," says Ron.

"Last season I was doing some lifeguard training. It was winter, the water was nice and flat and there were Dolphins. A lady had stopped halfway down the beach and squatted down to talk to her three year old, meanwhile, the 18-month-old had continued to toddle down to the water's edge. In this instance, it was just a little beach dumper but enough for the little girl to go to her knees then the next dumper put her on her backside. When I got to the girl she had been sucked out a good metre and her mum didn't even realise what had happened."

Patrols run from September to May including all public holidays; It is the luck of the draw whether you are volunteering on Christmas Day or Boxing Day, Ron has done a few Christmas Days and every Boxing Day – he said with a laugh. Our patrol might have some cake, or we might all bring a plate to share sometimes we might cook up a BBQ at the end of the patrol.

People on the beach might also bring you plates of prawns or other Christmas fare.

Things to remember before hitting the beach:

- Don't drink alcohol anywhere near the water
- ✓ Respect the conditions look out for Tidal Rips
- ✓ Stay hydrated
- Be sun safe to avoid heat stress and sunburn
- ✓ Swim between the flags
- Take note of the number at the beach access point if you are visiting a beach in Hervey Bay (just in case something happens)



Kevin was recently awarded 'Master' Status in the Coloured Pencil art form, voted by an international panel of judges, he is one of only 21 worldwide to reach this level of achievement. There are only 5 Australian's in this list, and he is the only Queenslander and proud to be a resident of the Fraser Coast.

The Artist has always had an interest in art and photography and since his first win at an art competition at the age of 13 in 1970, has created art to this very day. He has amassed an impressive portfolio of winning artworks in many competitions around Australia and internationally.

"Australian Artists" is a Facebook page Kevin began and has administered since 2013. The group has around 10,000 members across the country. Kevin has been married to Jeanette since 1980 and has two children, a twin boy and girl and two grandchildren. As husband and wife, they have done three laps of Australia and travelled many outback tracks in search of subjects for his artworks.

The Artist's exhibitions encompass works from as small as a postcard to as big as metre-wide pieces. There is something for everyone in his collection. Kevin says there is nothing like owning an original artwork. It is yours only and no-one in the world has one like it.

His latest 'Eclectica' Exhibition with over 100 artworks is running at the Maryborough Art Society, 282 Kent St, Maryborough until the 20th of December 2019.

THE TOWOUT OF CHRISTMAS by Kim Parnell

Ho ho ho, it's that time of the year again when Santa slides down the chimney, and we all get the chance to catch up with family and friends over the summer holidays and indulge ourselves a little with some special dishes on the Christmas dinner table.

Here's a couple of my favourite things to make for the family when the festive season rolls around:

Combine 650g cooked, shelled and de-veined Prawn & Mango salad Fraser Coast prawns, with 1 tablespoon lime juice, 1 tablespoon sweet chilli sauce and a pinch of ground

Cut mangoes into large wedges. white pepper.

Slice or julienne carrots and beetroot and slice cherry tomatoes to make a base layer on each plate.

Mound prawns and mango onto the salad items. Top with spinach or rocket leaves and drizzle over a

Serve on chilled plates straight from the fridge. tasty aioli to finish.

Blend 1 brown onion, 2 garlic cloves, 2 teaspoons ground coriander,1 teaspoon ground cumin, 400g dried chickpeas - that have been soaked overnight in cold water, 1 cup chopped fresh continental parsley



leaves, 1/3 cup plain flour or chick pea flour and 1 egg White in a food processor until almost smooth. Using floured hands, shape mixture into 2cm thick patties and refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Heat 1 tablespoon olive oil in a large frying pan over

Cook patties for 4 minutes each side or until cooked medium heat.

Serve on a spread of tahini or hummus and dress with salad & aioli.

With a busy home kitchen during the holidays, I recommend buying pre-made mini pavlova meringue Mini pavlovas shells from the supermarket and preparing some delicious thick cream filling topped with fresh fruits to create the colours of Christmas, & dusting with icing

Sugar just before serving. In a small bowl, beat 500ml thickened cream until stiff

Fill the centre of the meringues with the whipped cream, and top with fresh berries, mint leaves and mango and strawberry slices.

Dust with icing sugar.



to personal training. I am looking forward to working within the Community and offering lots of outdoor sessions in the future."




3. Burn the energy you eat



It was such an experience and so humbling meeting everyone over there. They are putting themselves on the line for us and our freedom. I think if it is the smallest thing that I can dotake a little piece of home and a little piece of music over to them - then that's what I will do.

What do you think it means to the soldiers?

It is really funny that you ask that because I have had so many people come up and thank me for going over. I know that they really do enjoy it

even if it is just to ask about the footy or the cricket score. Just simple questions that we take for granted on a daily basis.

I have always said that I will put my hand up and go back many times more as it is such a humbling experience.

Tell us about the Busby Marou remix of 'Lives on The Lawn' that supports flood victims of Townsville

Townsville holds a big place in my heart as I have spent so many years there.

When the floods occurred, I was living in Newcastle. The floods really broke my heart, a couple of my friends had their houses completely inundated with water.

I flew up to check out the damage and to see if my friends were ok - I drove to my friend Michelle's house but I didn't even have the guts to go inside to see her because I was just devastated by seeing people's homes and their lives basically put out on their front lawns. The thing that broke my heart the most was seeing Michelle's muddy fridge on the lawn and on the top was a family photo.

I was so affected that I popped up a social media post about seeing everyone's lives on the lawn - while writing this post I realised that it would be a great song title so, I called up a couple of friends of mine, Tammy and Dean, and told them that I really wanted to write a song. We sat down that night with a bottle of wine and a bowl of spaghetti and we came up with the lyrics for 'Lives on the Lawn' within about two hours.

They had both been evacuated so they had firsthand experience, it was really easy to put the emotion into the song. I say to everybody that it was the easiest song to write because there was so much content. But it was also the hardest song to write because you are writing about people's homes, their lives and what they have just lost

Tell us about your album's, including your newest – 'Dream Wild'.

My first album was 'great' and it was a completely uneducated album I guess, being the first one you never know what to expect.

My second album was 'Me' it was about the real me, who I actually am. When you write an album it is a journey, a piece of your heart on a little silver disc. You are hoping that people love it.

I am a little bit of a free spirit a little bit of a crazy child I like to get out there and explore new things so that was what that album was all about me living and sharing it with everybody.

I hear you have your motorcycle license, what do you enjoy about riding?

I do have a motorbike license; I am actually the Ambassador for Harley Davidson in Townsville. Whenever I am up there, they lend me a bike that I get to have for a couple of weeks so as I can go for a cruise.
